FALA saved Oscar from Death Row at one of L.A.'s city shelters. Oscar's guardian had died and the executor of the estate abandoned Oscar at the shelter. FALA President Charleen Sweeney was at the shelter rescuing two other cats who had been dropped off by their owner's son after their owner died. One of the workers at the shelter asked Charleen to rescue Oscar as well. No one at FALA has ever turned their back on an animal in such desperate need, so of course Charleen saved Oscar.

Oscar now lives in Hollywood with his new mom, Toni, and his new sister, Ruby, who also was adopted from FALA. Ruby was rescued from a feral cat colony where FALA volunteers were doing trap/neuter/release to help end generations of suffering by maintaining a stable feral colony. Ruby and Oscar are so grateful to be with their new mom in their new home.

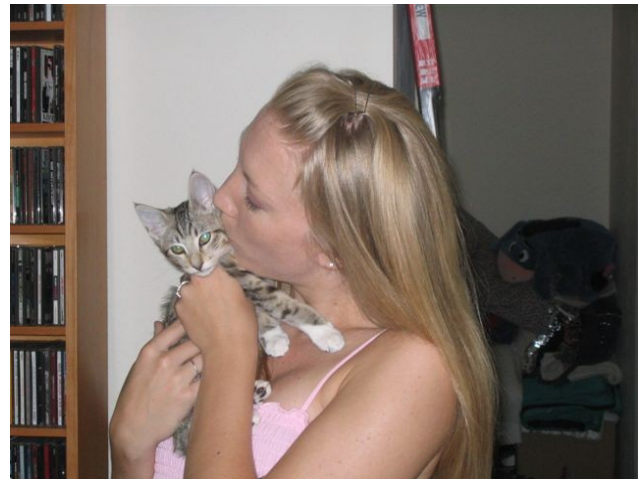

Charleen Sweeney rushed over to the house and found the cats trapped under the floor boards of a tool shed. Charleen freed these poor animals. After receiving the proper medical care and a lot of TLC, and now named Honey and Ginger, they moved into the home of their new guardian, John, in Atwater Village.
